## **Uniform Policy**

### Rationale

At Arcadia School, we believe that a smart uniform reflects pride and is in keeping with our high standards. Our school uniform is appropriate for children to be comfortable throughout the school day, while reflecting our high standards as a school. It is part of the parent agreement that all of our families sign, saying we will work together to uphold school policies, as we realise that the responsibility for purchasing the uniform, including wearing the correct footwear, comes from our parents, and we need your support with this. Please help us to ensure our students respect our school uniform and therefore uphold our values in doing so.

#### **Aims**

Our policy is based on the belief that a school uniform;

- + promotes a sense of pride in the school + engenders a feeling of belonging
- + is practical and distinctive + encourages an ethos of equality amongst pupils
- + reflects the norms of a high-quality international school and is culturally appropriate in Dubai

## Requirements at each key stage:

The full school uniform can be purchased online or in person at the uniform store. The PE and Games kits may be purchased online only.

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### **School Shoes**

Parents are required to purchase **BLACK** leather school shoes for daily wear, based on the following guideline:

### Girls

Black shoes: flat (no heel), lace up or velcro fastening (please note that velcro may be easier than laces for young children). Girls from Year 1 up are allowed to wear black slip-on shoes (ballet pump) but the heel must be flat.

Sports shoes/trainers are only to be worn with a PE kit.

### **Boys**

Black leather/leather looking smart shoes: flat (no heel), lace up or velcro fastening (please note that velcro may be easier than laces for young children).

**Secondary**- Shoes must be black smart leather shoes with hard heels. Any trainer looking shoe even if leather is not permitted.

Sports shoes/trainers are only to be worn with PE kit.

### Socks

White or Dark (Blue, Grey, Black) ankle socks (no stripes or bright colours ). White ankle socks for sports

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For your convenience, we also have school shoes available for purchase from our on-site uniform shop that meet the required guidelines of our uniform policy.

# **School Bags**

- School bags may be back-pack style only No trolley bags.
- Parents should note that children will only be carrying:
  - o a small number of books
  - PE kit bag (on specific days only)
  - o iPad (Year 3 and up)
  - lunch (if not purchased at the canteen),

Therefore, it is completely up to parents if they feel a school bag is necessary or not.

# **Jewellery and Headwear**

- For health and safety reasons, pupils may only wear small studs (no hanging earrings of any kind)
- Headwear is only to be worn inside for religious or medical reasons.
- Hairbands for girls are to be simple and in Arcadia colours only (no 'cat ears' or tiaratype head-wear).
- Ribbons/bows, if worn, must be small, simple and in Arcadia colours only (no 'oversized' ribbons/bows).
- Primary students should **NOT** be wearing jewellery of any kind apart from small stud earrings unless it is for religious purposes.
- Necklaces should not be visible and should be hidden by the school shirt, and only one small ring is permitted.
- Bracelets are **not** permitted

### **Hair and Nails**

- There should be no extreme haircuts such as shaved heads, bleached hair, or coloured hair.
- Nail polish must be clear or skin-toned. Coloured nail polish is not permitted.

- Boys no board shorts
- Cap and Goggles



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### PE Kit

# **Primary**

- A PE Kit should be worn to school whenever the child has PE, Y1-6
- Games Kit should be worn to school whenever the child has games: Y3-6 Games Kit may be worn to school whenever the child has a Games fixture: Y3-6

# Secondary

• Senior pupils are required to wear their regular school uniform to school each day and will bring their PE kit to school to change into on Sports/PE days.

### PROCESS FOR UNIFORM NON-COMPLIANCE

Level 1 – Reminder	First-time minor non-compliance (e.g. incorrect shoes).	Verbal reminder by teacher or form tutor.	Notified via school planner (if appropriate).	Recorded internally.
Level 2 – Warning	Repeated minor non-compliance (2nd offence).	Formal warning by Form/class Teacher; uniform expectations reexplained.	Email or phone call to parents.	Students may be sent to the Lost Property /Uniform Room for the correct item.
Level 3 – Reflection time	Continued non- compliance (4+ times) or moderate issue (e.g., repeated PE kit infractions).	Break/lunchtime reflection; behavior logged in the MIS.	Written notification; may be invited to attend a meeting.	Uniform checklists may be issued.
